







Commuting to work — not a bad ride!

How long does our daily work commute to take? In Maine, the mean work travel time is 23.6 minutes; Lincoln County is slightly higher, almost 25 minutes. In the 5-town area, the commute ranges from about 20 minutes for Damariscotta residents to almost 29 minutes for Nobleboro residents. *Where do we work?* Across the 5 towns, from 70 to 82 percent of residents work in Lincoln County, pretty typical for the State. An interesting difference is among South Bristol residents, where over 9 percent work out of state, roughly 3 times the "out-of-state" rate for its neighbors and the County, and more than twice the State rate.

1 The Homeownership Affordability Index is the ratio of Home Price Affordable at Median Income to Median Home Price. An index of less than 1 means the area is generally unaffordable - i.e., a household earning area median income could not cover the payment on a median priced home (30 year mortgage, taxes and insurance) using no more than 28% of gross income.
